



## WEATHER FORECAST GAME: WEEK 2 RESULTS

Maximum temperature: 12.8°C


Rainfall: 0mm

Relative Humidity at midday (UTC/GMT): 86%


In stark contrast to last week, I think this was probably the highest scoring week ever, with many people achieving scores over 10 and several people getting full marks. The maximum possible score is 16 and the minimum is -16.

The weather on the 28<sup>th</sup> was also very different to the weather on the 21<sup>st</sup>, with no rainfall and very steady temperatures. The images below show the synoptic chart for midday on the 28th, and the weather readings from Reading University's weather station. You can see that temperature rose slightly as the warm front passed through mid-morning, but there was no rain associated with this fairly weak warm front. In fact, if you go to <a href="http://wow.metoffice.gov.uk">http://wow.metoffice.gov.uk</a> and select the 'rainfall rate' layer and the start of the 28<sup>th</sup> in the time period and then move forward through the day, you'll see that only Scotland really got much rain. The cold front passed through on the 29<sup>th</sup>, producing considerably more rainfall.
