



Learning Design for: Learning how to design a poster

Context

Topic: This could be for any topic area

Total learning time: 2 hours

Designed learning time: 2 hours

Size of class: 36

Description: This specific learning design is derived from a generic one, itself derived from one to develop the skill of writing a literature review. It is designed for students with little or no familiarity with the skill.

Mode of delivery: Wholly online

Aims

1. To give students an overview of the role of the skill
2. To explain the place of the skill with the curriculum
3. To prepare students to undertake an application of the skill

Outcomes

Identify (Knowledge): identify relevant areas for applying the skill

Explain (Comprehension): Explain the relevance of each area

Apply (Application): Apply their initial understanding of the the nature of the skill to an application of it

Teaching-Learning activities

Before the scheduled session

Read Watch Listen 5 minutes 1 student Tutor is not available Online

Watch the video presentation, giving an overview of poster design, and its role, relevance, and scope in your subject area.

Produce 5 minutes 1 student Tutor is not available Online

Make notes.

Prepare one question about the video to ask in the session.

Scheduled session: Planning for designing a poster

Discuss *10 minutes* *36 students* *Tutor is available* *Online*

Join the discussion about the video. Raise your hand to ask questions about it, and contribute verbally and in Chat your suggestions in response to the other students' questions. Consolidate and clarify any remaining issues.

Watch the teacher's explanation of the task

Practice *4 minutes* *1 student* *Tutor is available* *Online*

Think and write individually on the Googledoc your idea for the most important feature of a successful poster design.

Collaborate *10 minutes* *6 students* *Tutor is not available* *Online*

In groups of six, discuss your ideas and write on the Miro Board your decision of what are the three most important features of a good poster design.

Produce *5 minutes* *6 students* *Tutor is available* *Online*

Choose one person from your group to write your top idea on the Googledoc, with your group number.

Practice *10 minutes* *1 student* *Tutor is not available* *Online*

Working individually, make a plan for designing a poster for a context of your choice. Identify one thing you will do next to improve your skill.

Discuss *10 minutes* *36 students* *Tutor is available* *Online*

Join the closing plenary overview discussion. What would your group need to do next to continue learning in this area?

Follow-up

Produce *30 minutes* *6 students* *Tutor is not available* *Online*

Post your draft plan to your Group's site in the Moodle forum.
Give peer feedback to others in your group on their good points, and on which areas to improve.

Revise your draft in preparation for your summative assessment task on designing a poster.

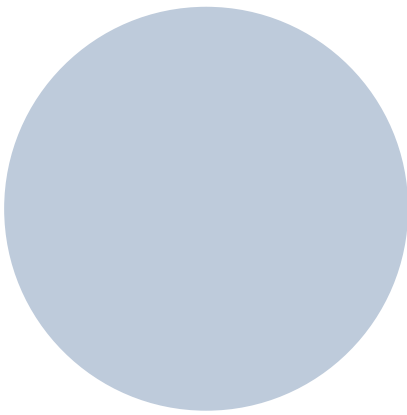

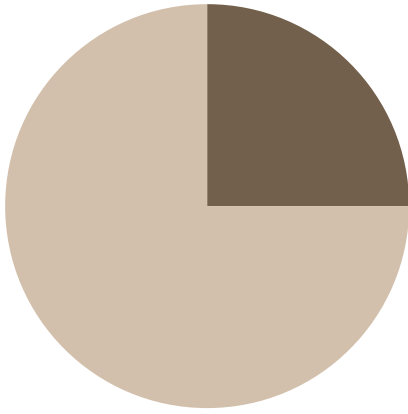
