Members of my community have equal access to the rights in the UDHR.

Members of my community can freely express their beliefs and ideas without the fear of being discriminated against, excluded, threatened or attacked.

Members of my community welcome people who seek asylum because they are persecuted in their country.

Members of my community can vote and are able to take part in government.  (UDHR, Article 21)					
Members of my community are never treated or punished in a way that is degrading or cruel, or makes them feel less human.
